WORKING OVERTIME IN SUMMER MONTHS

It's been an interesting summer to say the least! The need for food and support for our community families has never been greater. The Tinervin Family Foundation has stepped up our work with the community thanks to you, our amazing volunteers and partners! This summer we've grown our volunteer network, added strategic partners, and increased the supply and delivery of food to those in need. As always, it's your continued financial support that helps us fill this growing need.

In addition to our normal food deliveries, the summer months brought increased food demand from local schools. We've partnered with the United Way to provide regular food deliveries to District 87 schools as well as Leroy, Lexington, Olympia, and Ridgeview districts. Over the course of the summer we've delivered more than 3,500 boxes to rural and local schools.

We've also continued to add new partners to assist with our mobile food distribution operation: Mt. Pisgah Baptist Church, New Mennonite Church, and Abundant Life in Christ Church. When accounting for our new and existing partnerships we have delivered over 6,000 food boxes over the past three months.

PARTNER HIGHLIGHT



United Way
of McLean County

The United Way of McLean County works to meet the most critical needs in McLean County by mobilizing efforts that will create the biggest impact in the community. David sees the organization as a conviener and coordinator of resources to help the community address its most critical needs.

The recent COVID situation has caused the organization to broaden the approach they've taken with their Feeding B/N and Beyond program. According to David Taylor, President & CEO United Way of McLean County, there are around 24,000 households in McLean County considered financially unstable. About

half of those are in poverty and the other half are considered ALICE households. ALICE stands for Access Limited, Income Constrained, Employeed and represents many people who are working paycheck to paycheck and have to make tradeoffs with what they need and what they can afford. Many of these ALICE households don't have a preexisting relationship with government or social services agencies, so they don't know where to turn for help.

If we do that, now instead of \$15 dollars a box, maybe it's down to \$10 a box because we're leveraging our scale.

This and the desire to do something more impactful in our local community was the spark for conversations between the United Way of McLean County and the Tinervin Family Foundation. David feels that the UWMC and TFF are philosophically aligned. "We're both looking to provide a benefit to people with food insecurities, but do it in a way that is economically efficieny and cost

effective. So instead of doing something one-off, how do we do it at a community scale? Instead of 1,000 food boxes per month, how do we get to four or five thousand? If we do that, now instead of \$15 dollars a box, maybe it's down to \$10 a box because we're leveraging our scale."

David finishes with, "We are excited about the possibilities of the partnership. We've got a couple of organizations trying to do this at a county-wide scale and I think the community and the organizations can benefit if we start thinking through that lens and think about how we're actually benefiting the community."
