## 2022 PARTNERING WITH A PURPOSE

While we continued providing food through our mobile food pantry (about 5,500 boxes through August), we've been focusing on some big projects and partnerships. We've been working diligently on new facilities for the Western Avenue Community Center and funding a new Carle Mobile Health Clinic. These ventures will bring additional services directly to the community.

On July 12<sup>th</sup>, board members from the Tinervin Family Foundation, the United Way of McLean County, Carle, and the Western Avenue Community Center, met to discuss their partnership and vision for the future, asking everyone in attendance to start thinking big about how we can positively impact our community. Tinervin from TFF, David Taylor from UWMC, Colleen Kannaday from Carle, and Mike Jones from WACC shared goals and objectives of their individual organizations and highlighted the coming together of these groups to bring a new Carle Mobile Medical Clinic to McLean county. The mobile medical clinic will be funded through a partnership between TFF (\$150k), United Way of McLean County (\$150k), Laborers' Local 362 (\$100k), City of Bloomington (\$150k), Town of Normal (\$100k), and McLean County (\$100k). Carle will supply personnel and handle ongoing operational expenses.

As you can see, your continued support is making a direct impact on food insecurity in our community and is helping us provide healthcare access to those underserved populations in our local area. Thank you!

## PARTNER SPOTLIGHT – COLLEEN KANNADAY

Colleen Kannaday is the President of Carle BroMenn Medical Center and has represented Carle's involvement in securing a brand new mobile medical unit for McLean County (expected to be operational by the end of the year). Originally from Spokane, WA, she's lived in the Bloomington/Normal area for the past 12 years.

Colleen's father was a health care administrator and her mother was a nurse, so she's been involved in health care administration her whole life and decided to follow her father's footsteps. She knew from an early age she loved health care because it was truly about making a difference for people and making a difference for a broader community.

Making a difference for our local community is one aspect she loves about the developing partnership with the Tinervin Family Foundation, United Way, and Western Avenue, but she also appreciates the partnership's special nature saying, "When you think of how many other nonprofits run and operate, this is quite different. This partnership is really nimble and focus on the business. The time from idea to execution has been very fast. It is truly very unique."

When the Tinervin Foundation, United Way, Western Ave, and Carle came together to talk about where the needs were, Colleen says there was a natural synergy. "It was easy to see where our mission and our values aligned. It became evident that each of us was willing to put our self-interest aside and meet as equal contributing parts coming to the table. We shared our ideas and started creating a vision so much greater than we could each do individually." She indicated this partnership has generated a lot of momentum, prompting other outside groups to ask how they can be a part of it.

on the responsibility for raising money to build the mobile medical unit, Carle's commitment will be to handle the ongoing expenses of its continued operation. Once built, partners can leverage current relationships with schools, churches, and other organization to help determine where and when the unit will operate.

When asked about closing thoughts, Colleen said, "I want to express my gratitude and thanks to all our partners, but want to acknowledge that the Tinervin Family Foundation and Jeff Tinervin have been a primary catalyst for all this to happen. I'm thankful for the trust that's been placed in Carle for the operations of this. We want to be good stewards of all the precious resources so many of our partners are putting together to make this a reality. We believe this is just the beginning of the good we'll be able to do by working together."

### MOBILE FOOD DISTRIBUTION

Through August of this year, partnering with the Midwest Food Bank and the United Way of McLean County, we have delivered around 5,500 food boxes! Our distribution locations include:

### ADOPT A FAMILY

Families are selected by organizations based on financial hardship and need—need for themselves, their children and their homes. During 2021, 59 families were adopted! Twenty-one were sponsored by donors and the rest were sponsored by the TFF.

### SHOES FOR KIDS

This year we handed out 358 pairs shoes to kids in need during the Christmas season. We had 206 pairs of shoes donated by golfers at this years event and the TFF purchased an additional 152 pairs.

### TOY DRIVE

For over 20 years, the Tinervin Family Foundation has provided toys, clothing and other gifts to boys and girls in our local community during the Christmas season.

### HALFWAY HOUSE FOR ALCOHOL AND DRUG RECOVERY

The Tinervin Family Foundation has purchased a home for those in need of drug and alcohol recovery. This helps them adjust to life in general society.

### SUPPORT FOR HEALTHY BEGINNINGS

Carle's Healthy Beginnings program works to ensure children and families have an opportunity to be as healthy and prosperous as they can. This year TFF donated 15 car seats and 15 bus passes to the program.

### MCCA

The foundation donated \$2,500 to MCCA and Neville House for their domestic violence fundraiser. Our ongoing relationship continues to expand, and we are very proud to be the recipient of the 2020 MCCA Innovator Award.

### WESTERN AVENUE COMMUNITY CENTER

The foundation highly values its relationship with Western Avenue. This non-profit organization offers many programs to support members of our local community. The Tinervin Family Foundation has pledged \$150,000 for new signage, landscaping and other building upgrades and an additional \$50,000 for its operating budget in 2022.

### UNITED WAY WORKFORCE 180 PROGRAM

The Tinervin Family Foundation and First Site are each contributing \$8,000 and sponsoring a student in UW's Workforce 180 program. The program helps students with things like tuition, transportation, and daycare. It is designed to help participants develop skills and experience to enter the workforce and become self-sufficient and thriving individuals. The United Way is actively looking for more sponsors to participate in the program.
